Spiritual Directors Group, Tasmania

On 7th November, we had our second meeting for the year, via Zoom. The use of technology has helped us to maintain connection during this most unusual year.

After a gathering prayer and reflection that enabled us to place our burdens and ourselves in God's hands, we shared the experiences of our journey since our last meeting, with a focus on highlights/ significant events and learnings.

For several of us, these past months have been a time of quiet reflection and discernment, searching, listening and acknowledging that in the life stage we are each living, God is calling us towards change. In this there is recognition of the Spirit as "disrupter" and also acknowledgement of hope and trust in God's love and guidance whilst transitioning towards the new.

Two of our members have been led to resign from their ministry of Spiritual Direction. This has brought deep gratitude and wonder for the experience of walking with many people who entrusted so much of their lives in their sharing as directees. Gratitude is accompanied by grief at the loss of these relationships, and also the loss of the Spiritual Direction community. Our remaining members spoke of their experience of those who are leaving, with the love and gentleness that comes from many occasions of deep sharing and holding of each other in community.

Learnings have come with the processes of quiet discernment. Some have been challenged with practising patience and discovered the fruits of this learning. Opening up to having more directees has been the fruit of acceptance and some have received new requests for Spiritual Direction.

Looking ahead as a smaller group, it was acknowledged that there would be challenges, and that the loss of Emmanuel as our spiritual home is still painful. Along with this, there is hope for the future, and trust that God has a vision that will keep the group connected and loving each other. There are still directees in each region, so there will still be State wide gatherings, and there is certainty that the Divine will be present and life-giving in all activities. There is gratitude for the development each has experienced over the years in their role as directors, and encouragement to move out into the world and share the fruits of this development. Next year the Directors located in the South of the state will organise and lead the gatherings for 2021. There were no volunteers for the role of CSD Representative, so this is the last article from Tasmania until such time as one of our members feels called to take on the role.

Vale Sister Dawn Bang rsc




Tim Moloney CFC reviews 'Grace' by Michael Casey OCSO

Many travellers to Tarrawarra Abbey would know Michael Casey and value his wisdom and scholarly approach to spirituality. Michael invites the reader to listen to the voice of God in their heart and to look back and wonder at what God has done in their life. He invites the reader to look at the way Grace appears in one's life, whether it appears in the dark recesses or in the places of great life and see that whatever comes is a gift from God and not the result of our actions.

Michael approaches Grace: On the Journey to God from so many angles starting from discontinuity and desire through to community and communion.

These last two themes appealed to me. He invites the reader to ponder that one is given gifts to share with others. We are the better for sharing who we are in our strengths and our weaknesses. As Michael says, we do not travel alone, we travel together (p199, *Paraclete 2018*). This journey was started by our ancestors and will be continued by generations to come.

Michael writes in an engaging and uncomplicated manner which is very accessible. I recommend this book highly.
