
Voice Prayer


Membership Paid

Favourite Scripture: Isaiah 61: 3



Memorable Moment: Listening to a pilgrim who I have walked with for


years, sharing his encounters

Spiritual Direction in the Professional Space with Dr Bernadette Miles Saturday August 19th 9.30am - 11.00am (AEDT)

In 2022, Kardia Formation Pty. Ltd, with the support of the Patrick and Anthony Wright Formation and Education Fund and the University of Divinity, conducted research to examine how critical reflection through spiritual direction could support teachers in developing resilience, teacher formation and wellbeing. An empirical study was conducted over 8 months with 38 teachers who were offered 8 sessions of spiritual direction. All participants completed a survey and 10 participants attended individual interviews prior to commencing spiritual direction and on completion of the eight sessions. Data collected was both quantitative and qualitative.

This workshop will explore the results of this research and pose the question: How is spiritual direction moving beyond the traditional and religious contexts?

Dr Bernadette Miles is one of the directors of Kardia Formation. She has completed the Arrupe Program for spiritual directors in the Ignatian tradition, Siloam and has 20 years experience in forming spiritual directors, supervision, spiritual direction, facilitation and retreat giving. Bernadette completed PhD research in 2018 which explores the contribution spiritual direction in the Ignatian tradition can make to leadership and organisational development.




June Professional Development Feedback

Joint Spirituality Centre Development Day: Padraig O Tuama - Masterclass: Spirituality & Conflict

On the 9th May it was a delight to return to WellSpring in Ashburton to attend a joint Spirituality Centre Day. Irish poet and theologian Padraig O' Tuama invited us all to become curious and our imagination to explore the management of conflict through the power of story and poetry. He shared his lived experience and offered us powerful examples using poetry and Gospel passages, which invited the reader to pay closer attention to conflict on many different levels.

The conversations held throughout the day allowed us to experience such questions like: What does the word lost mean to you?

Padraig allowed us to deepen such a question through the use of a poem by David Wagner entitled *Lost*. The phrases that stirred me were.

Stand Still. The trees ahead and bushes beside you Are not lost. Wherever you are is called Here And you must treat it as a powerful stranger

This poem became a portal from which my imagination danced around with the concept of being Lost. It invited me to become curious about the poet's meaning of the word, and then with the help of the poet's use of imagery it allowed me to explore what it meant personally.

This created a welcoming and open environment which invited the groups to enter into dialogue about such experiences

The power of Padraig's story telling enabled us to create a welcoming open space for authentic conversations about the varied conflicts that we experienced.

It was a great opportunity to share such conversations with members of the other Spirituality Centres on the day.

What's happening in AECSD?

AECSD met in Melbourne from the 16th to the 17th of March 2023 and again online on the 18th of May. During these meetings we heard reports from the Spiritual Direction associations and celebrated the work of these networks. We also heard an update from the Supervision Guidelines Working Group and affirmed their progress. A substantial aspect of these meetings was discussion concerning the National Register for Spiritual Direction.

National Register for Spiritual Direction

Over the past two years a working group has been exploring the possibility of a register of spiritual directors in Australia. After gathering responses from contemplative discernment circles and surveys the working group developed a model for a register which would list: name, location, contact, particular interest, and optionally photograph, spiritual tradition, and availability in person/online etc. While all spiritual directors could apply to be on the register, the register would check qualifications and ongoing professional development and supervision.

The wisdom of the larger community that has been gleaned from the working group and consultative process could thus be implemented. This could include, for example, accountability structures, regulatory issues, standardisation of policy, (allowing for the diversity, integrity and core work of each organisation), increasing safety and supporting raising the profile of spiritual direction in Australia.

The present outcome is that the national spiritual direction associations in Australia – ANSD (Australian Network for Spiritual Direction, CSD Australia (Conference of Spiritual Directors), and Companions (Companions in the Ministry of the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises) will continue and develop their listings/registers individually rather than there being a national register or standardised guidelines.

Gathering of Contemplatives

Monday - Monday, August 7 - 14th, 2023

Drew Lawson has organised a *gathering of contemplatives* retreat at Santa Casa Retreat Centre 7 - 14 August 2023 and has a few places left.

The retreat will begin on Monday 7th August 2023 and end on Monday 14th August 2023. It will be held at Santa Casa in Queenscliff.

Contemplatio: Spiritual Direction in the Light of Contemplation Tuesday - Wednesday, August 22 - 23rd, 2023

This course will be offered face to face and online as an intensive over two days. Each day will consist of:

• Three teaching sessions of 90 minutes where, drawing on the original mystical texts within their respective contexts, Kerrie will guide a meditation and offer a teaching, explaining these texts in relation to their wisdom and praxis for spiritual directors as well as for deepening in the mystical life.



- Morning, afternoon and evening guided meditation developing and practicing ways of prayer that are an expression of this wisdom.
- Opportunity for small group sharing in confidential, trustworthy, sacred spaciousness where participants are safe to explore the depths of the Spirit's drawing.
- Two follow up zoom sessions to enable the integration and stabilising of the learnings. Dates for these session will be announced shortly
