This week we have National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday (run by NATSICC) as well as NAIDOC Week (National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee). Thankfully with a growing awareness of the distinct cultural histories of Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders it became a whole week, not just a day. The second session of the Plenary Council of the Catholic Church, also began just on Sunday and acknowledged the day. It is a time of deep reflection for the Church in Australia; a time for remembering and examining where we have come from, where we are, and where the Holy Spirit wants us to go.



Mumeri was created by Dr Lisa Buxton in August 2013 to celebrate the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney's inaugural Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mass held at St Mary's Cathedral. The theme for the Mass 'Holy Spirit in this Land' was captured in the artwork through the use of Aboriginal and Catholic symbolism.

## **Membership Renewals From the Treasurer**

I've had an interesting time since the end of May when all members were emailed regarding membership renewal due by 30 June 2022.

I enjoyed the engagement with members as the names on the list became real people with phone calls and emails such as about circumstances around retirement and/or a change of ministry, retreats, upcoming relocations or home renovations, or the closing of a spirituality centre.



#### **Memberships Paid**

- 178 members were sent membership renewal requests.
- 136 members have paid. This includes 4 who paid for two years last year. (That's a bit more than 75%)
  - 26 members who have paid are still due to send in their form. [Some have explained that they are in process, which is fine.]
  - 8 members have changed circumstances, some becoming honorary members due to retirement.
  - 34 members have made no response. [These figures are until 1st July.]

No mystery payments so far this year so thanks for putting your name in the reference. Your cooperation with this, as well as my notes from last year, have helped the process to run smoothly.

#### **Membership Renewal Forms**

It's been encouraging to see that the practice of spiritual direction is alive and well throughout the country as shown by the regular supervision members are receiving and the extensive professional development undertaken. I must admit that in seeing the professional development listed my response is "Oh, that sounds interesting" and "I would have liked to have done that."

Thank you to all those who completed the form in one way or another. It is a mystery why the fillable form works so easily for some and not at all for others. I've had a wide range of responses from "Thanks for the instructions, they were really helpful" to the other extreme "I don't have Microsoft Word on my computer." All but 20 members who have returned the form managed to return it via email. This is a work in progress to create the form in such a way that all can easily fill it in on their computer.

Membership certificate will be issued over the coming month for those who have returned the completed renewal declaration form and paid the membership fee.

## Vale Sr. Yvonne Harte rsj



Some years ago the Conference of Spiritual Directors was in danger of closing down. There was a conference in Hobart where an ageing group decided it was TIME! That CSD had served its purpose of supporting Religious who were opening up Spiritual Direction to many in Australia and New Zealand.

A dynamic character in Fr. Brian Gallagher MSC did not want that to happen. No one in a large group of 70 Spiritual Directors could take on the leadership of CSD. Brian as many of us know is a great writer in Spirituality but also a determined man when need be. He spoke to Yvonne Harte and I whose first response was NO we are too busy!!

Brian in his gentle, convincing manner received a yes from Yvonne and then me that we would be commitment to restructuring CSD for 12 months. Well two and a half years after many meetings, we increased the membership, communications network and local state leadership to see CSD alive as well. Yvonne was disciplined, that dreamers like me came up with good ideas but they had to be seen through in practical ways. As secretary, supporting Brian Gallagher, creative ideas became reality. Our first International conference through satellite, beaming a seminar of Korean Spirituality with Paul Beirne was so successful. No zoom in those days; people locked themselves in from New Zealand, throughout


