
Membership








Joint Spirituality Centre Development Day: Padraig O Tuama - Poetry and Prayer

Over three wonderful sessions many gathered to sit under nourishing tones of Padraig OTauma as he guided us to the deep place of intersection between poetry and prayer. Like any good spiritual director, Padraig used the power of question to draw us deeper, and to invited us there to listen give expression to the questions, pain, desire, longing, and uncertainty within us.

God help me -

the sea is so big

and my boat is so small

This Breton Fisherman's prayer opened the first session. Pondering these words we were reminded that the way we believe in God is the way we believe in power. We are so small and God is so big – could it be that God 'might' just help us in a time of uncertainty? Do we dare to believe that our prayer will be answered or does our fear of the power and might of the one we call on leave us unable to cry out?

Padraig opened the space for us to strip back the layers and honestly contemplate our relationship with desire, where/what we cling to when faced with uncertainty, how to pay sacred attention to the moment, who we address our prayers to and how, and finally, the idea of absent presence. We listened to prayers/poems, considered the role of creed, wrote a collect (gathering prayer), shared reflections in small groups, and recognised the importance of blessings.

Having heard Padraig speak in Brisbane last year and hear that he had given up devotion, I was curious that he was offering teaching on prayer. Having been part of the three online sessions I was grateful for the opportunity to learn from him and was reminded again that we don't have all the answers, the Kingdom is spacious, poetry is prayer is poetry - the stream of longing deep in our life where we continue to seek that 'one thing'.

The Australian Ecumenical Council for Spiritual Direction (AECSD) has facilitated a ground-breaking conversation on spiritual direction supervision, resulting in draft *Formation Guidelines for Supervisors of Spiritual Directors*. Building on previous consultations, the updated draft names the diverse pathways that form supervisors of spiritual directors; describes supervisory needs at different stages of a spiritual director's development; and identifies core components of supervision formation.

We invite all spiritual direction supervisors, formators and interested spiritual directors into a facilitated conversation to be held the day after the 2024 AECSD Gathering on The Paschal Mystery. We will engage with the proposed Guidelines, invite feedback, and discuss how they could be used in practice. This will advance the conversation regarding appropriate recognition criteria for supervision formation programs.
